SCOTTY'S CONTRACTING AND STONE LLC WINS NATIONAL AWARD FOR QUALITY IN ASPHALT PAVING

Lanham, Md. — The National Asphalt Pavement Association (NAPA) announced today that Scotty's Contracting and Stone LLC of Bowling Green, Ky., has won a 2015 Quality in Construction Award for excellence in construction of an asphalt pavement. The company received its award on Wednesday, February 10, at a ceremony during the association's 61st Annual Meeting in La Quinta, Calif.

"The asphalt pavement industry is committed to building quality pavements that deliver high performance and drivability to the public," said Michael Cote, NAPA 2015 Chairman. "All contractor's projects earning a Quality in Construction Award are measured against industry best practices designed to live up to our promise. I'm honored to say that, in earning a 2015 QIC Award, Scotty's Contracting and Stone has met or exceeded these rigorous standards."

Scotty's Contracting and Stone won the award for its work on U.S. 68 and U.S. 68X in Logan County. This project involved milling and overlaying a portion of the bypass and the main section of the roadway that runs through Russellville, including the area around the square. The job required careful scheduling and some night paving through town, and Scotty's Contracting had to communicate with area businesses to ensure that the road would be clear of vehicles during paving times. Some portions of the job required changes to roller patterns to preserve underground clay utility piping. The company completed a smooth, high-quality road ahead of schedule.
