SCOTTY'S CONTRACTING AND STONE LLC WINS NATIONAL AWARD FOR QUALITY IN ASPHALT PAVING

Lanham, Md. — The National Asphalt Pavement Association (NAPA) announced today that Scotty's Contracting and Stone LLC of Bowling Green, Ky., has won a 2015 Quality in Construction Award for excellence in construction of an asphalt pavement. The company received its award on Wednesday, February 10, at a ceremony during the association's 61st Annual Meeting in La Quinta, Calif.

"The asphalt pavement industry is committed to building quality pavements that deliver high performance and drivability to the public," said Michael Cote, NAPA 2015 Chairman. "All contractor's projects earning a Quality in Construction Award are measured against industry best practices designed to live up to our promise. I'm honored to say that, in earning a 2015 QIC Award, Scotty's Contracting and Stone has met or exceeded these rigorous standards."

Scotty's Contracting and Stone won the award for its work on I-65 in Barren and Hart counties. The company added a lane and a shoulder in each direction, and a permanent dividing barrier wall in the median. Work also included drainage, bridge, and interchange construction. Careful attention to phasing and scheduling was extremely important because Scotty's Contracting and Stone had to maintain two lanes of traffic during daytime hours and one lane at night. For the surface coat of asphalt, the company used a warm-mix additive that aided in compaction and enabled paving of a single lane through the entire length of the project in one night. The company finished the project ahead of schedule and with a roadway that showed excellent testing results and ride quality.
